OLD BUSINESS

- 1. Approve Minutes:
 - a. Lois motioned to approve the minutes. Rachel 2nd the motion. All were in favor.
- 2. Approve Treasurer's Report
 - a. Roger mentioned that staff has had an increase in hours over the last couple of months. If the staff has plenty of hours in the next three months they may go past 10%. Something to be aware of.
 - b. Terry motioned to approve the report. John 2nd the motion. All were in favor.
- 3. Reduce waste stickers or window clings Dana couldn't find any that had been made of recycled materials. The group felt that sending stickers to new members would be a good idea. Renewing members could request a window car cling or sticker, via the renewal form. The group also liked offering window clings to businesses for their membership. Dana to look more into how much they will cost and order a small amount.
- 4. Pumpkin Recycling program "Feed the Goats" follow-up Linda and Dana have both reached out and were given feedback that feeding the goats pumpkins once/year could be hard for their diet and haven't had anyone interested. Dana thinks collecting them to be composted is the better option and will check with Andy on specifics. She will need to get permission from Hy-Vee and moving on advertising the event soon. The collection would be start out for the first year of just filling Dana's truck.

- Attended Eagle village board meeting to discuss resuming recycling options
- Held KCCB Appreciation Event for 60 guests at Slattery Vintage Estates, gave awards and recognized John Baroni, Roger Behrns and Rick Yoder for each completing 9 years of service on the board
- Provided litter cleanup supplies for Louisville home school group
